- 1. Attend or send a proxy to at least two Student Advisory Committee meetings each year our child is in attendance at School of the Future
- 2. Check grades at least once a week on the parent portal
- 3. Attend Back to School Night and parent teacher conferences or email/call educators about learner progress
- 4. Attend 9th grade and new learner orientation sessions
- 5. Update all contact information in real time 6. Attend at least 1 SOF open house office hours event
- 7. Attend at least 2 virtual engagement opportunities.

- 1. Check our grades weekly on the portal
- 2. Follow all school and classroom norms and expectations
- 3. Sign up for at least one extra-curricular activity
- 4. Take pride in our work
